

Kingfisher



- Kingfishers nest in burrows in riverbanks; this means their babies are at risk if the river floods
- They have an orange belly and a bright blue back
- They like slow moving clean rivers and streams. If you see kingfishers, it means the water must be unpolluted
- Baby kingfishers can eat up to 18 fish every day and the adults may be feeding 7 chicks
- An adult kingfisher can handle a fish half its own body size
- They like to hunt from perches above the water
